



● **Juneau Arts & Humanities Council, 350 Whittier St. at JACC (former Armory Building)** Blue Clay Studios introduces new works at their exhibition FIRE WORKS. Works of Paul Voelckers, James Voelckers, Matt Voelckers, Dean Guaneli, Mary Pat Wyatt and Janeanne Twelker, produced in their home studios in Juneau and Douglas and at the UAS studio.
