



● **Juneau Arts & Humanities Council**, 350 Whittier St. at JACC (former Armory Building). On display is "Contemporary Traditions," a partnership collection of Northwest Coast wood carvings by local artists Ray Watkins of Juneau and Duane Bosch of Hoonah. Working primarily in the style of the northern Tlingit tradition, and inspired by the power and beauty of nature, Watkins and Bosch have carved a series of masks, rattles, boxes, and panels, which are a potent reflection of their love for this ancient and beautiful art form. Over 40 new works as well as select pieces from private collections will be on display. The Juneau Artist Market will take place on the JACC lawn (or in the JACC hall if it rains), in conjunction with the 2nd Friday gallery reception. 4:30 - 7 pm.

● **Alaska State Museum**, 395 Whittier St. Continuing Exhibits: 1) "From Gift to Gallery: New Acquisitions 2004-2009" provides insight into the process of collecting, and includes over 100 of the approximately 500 objects acquired by the museum since 2004. 2) The biennial "Alaska Positive" juried photographic exhibit features work by photographers from all over the state. 3) Sue Kraft: Solo Artist Exhibit. Kraft has lived, worked and painted in Alaska for over 30 years. Her paintings range from small watercolors to large oil paintings. Free admission on 2nd Friday, 4:30 - 7 pm.

● **Juneau-Douglas City Museum**, 4th & Main streets. Continuing Exhibit: "All Things Eagle & Raven" features a variety of exhibits celebrating these two birds and their connections to SE life, including Tlingit phrases, Northwest Coast art, a video of Yees Ku Oo dance group performing eagle and raven songs, local eagle and raven photographs, and illustrated stories submitted by members of the community. 9 am - 5 pm. Admission: \$4 Adults, 12 and under, free.

● **Back Room at the Silverbow Inn & Bakery**, 120 2nd. Continuing Exhibit: Clay sculptures of sea creatures by Barbara Lydon will be on display. Regular opening hours: 6:30 am - 8 pm.

● **The Canvas Community Art Studio & Gallery**, 223 Seward St. Recent paintings by Plein Rein will be on display. Plein Rein is a collection of kindred spirits who meet Saturday mornings - rain, shine, snow or sleet - and usually get out to paint en plein air. The group has been meeting for nearly a decade. Plein Rein enjoys sharing their recent landscapes done in watercolor, pastels, acrylics and oils. 4:30 - 7 pm.

● **Annie Kaill's**, 244 Front St. The gallery will not have a featured guest artist this month, but will be open late 2nd Friday with snacks and their usual assortment of Alaska artwork, including 3 new prints by John Fehringer. 4:30 - 7 pm.

● **Aunt Claudia's Dolls Museum**, 114 South Franklin St., Suite 105, above Hearthside Books. Continuing Exhibit: On display is a collection of Claudia Kelsey, containing more than 500 dolls and miniatures collected from all over the world. Open to the public 2-7 pm on 2nd Friday, and noon - 4 pm Saturday.

● **Juneau Artists Gallery**, 175 S. Franklin (in the Senate Building). Woodturner Les Howard is the featured artist of the month. Howard specializes in small vessels, pens and pencils, and bottle stoppers turned from locally-harvested and grown woods such as Douglas maple, willow, red alder, mountain ash, lilac and rhododendron. New this year are earrings and pendants formed into different shapes from scraps of wood that demonstrate an interesting grain pattern. Howard will be at the gallery for the 2nd Friday reception, 4:30 - 7:30 pm.
