● **Juneau Arts & Humanities Council, 350 Whittier St. at JACC (former Armory Building).** Works by Neil Slotnick and Dan Branch, both working in wood. Slotnick uses a lathe to create bowls, vases, platters, and jewelry from Alaskan wood, Branch hand carves forms using Northwest Coast carving techniques to create masks and images inspired by his surroundings and interests. The artists will donate ½ of their proceeds to support the AWARE shelter. 4:30 - 7pm. **ALSO:** at 4:30 - 6 pm, in the Main Hall, The Society for Creative Anachronism - a world wide group that strives to re-create aspects of the middle ages and renaissance, - will be demonstrating aspects of their chivalric armoured combat.

● **Alaska State Museum, 395 Whittier St.** Juneau's **Dan Fruits** will show oil paintings and mono-prints exploring Alaskan landscapes, villages, flora and fauna. A gallery walk-thru and slide show of Fruits' work will be held Nov. 14. **Stephen Gray**, of Anchorage, will show a select grouping of images from his ongoing project, Billy Adventures series, an exploration of the dialectic between the "good little boy" and the dark boundaries of the human psyche. **Hall Anderson**, of Ketchikan, will show a selection of photographs from Anderson's 23 years of work as the staff photographer for the Ketchikan Daily News. The images are from a soon to published book of his work. Their shows will run through January 15, 2010. Reception: 4:30-7 pm.

● **Back Room at the Silverbow Inn & Bakery, 120 2nd.** Four new acrylic paintings by expressionist painter Lotty will be on display. Lotty's collection of black & white melancholy paintings explore gray areas, womenly pride and abstract scenery. Lotty relates to shades, not color, hence the name Gray Area Artworks by Lotty. 5-7 pm.

● **Juneau-Douglas City Museum, 4th and Main St.** The museum presents a new collaborative exhibit titled The "Mighty J" and Only Ten Survived. The "Mighty J" includes objects and photographs from the Juneau-Douglas City Museum's permanent collection related to the first USS Juneau CL-52, an anti-aircraft cruiser, the second USS Juneau, the light cruiser CL 119 and the third USS Juneau, the amphibious transport dock LPD 10. 4:30 - 7:30 pm.

● **The Canvas Community Art Studio & Gallery, 223 Seward St.** David Riccio and Jackie Manning are the featured artists in November. Riccio will show "Seldom Seen Silks & Newly Fired Ceramics", displaying recent ceramics and a selection of silk paintings created over the last 10 years. The show will celebrate line, dot, and color. Jackie Manning will show paintings and mixed media art in "Humanity and Nature II." 4:30-7 pm.

● **The Plant People, 224 Seward St.** David Depew has been a Juneau resident since 1995. In addition to wool socks and sensible shoes he has a background in forensic photography and brings these skills to his explorations of geometry and light. 4:30-7 pm.

● **Annie Kaill's, 244 Front St,** Barbara Lavallee, of "Mama Do You Love Me?" fame, is back for her annual book signing and to show prints and originals. She will be joined by Juneau artist Alice Tersteeg, who will show a series of pastels in an exhibit titled "Chrome and other reflective surfaces." 4:30 - 7 pm.

● **Ruby Room, in the Emporium Mall behind Heritage Coffee.** Traditional, Pictorial & Art Quilted Wall Hangings by Carol Suring can be seen at the Ruby Room. The show will feature various techniques including appliqué, hand dyed fabrics, thread and ink drawing, and traditional piecing. This show features her recent wall hanging work and she will be flying in from Idaho to be on hand for the event. 4:30 -7:30 pm.

● **Skeins Fine Yarns, 175 S Franklin St (Senate Building).** Skeins will feature fine mosaic & glass art frames, trivets, jewelry boxes, tables, bird houses by Christine McQuitty of Ptree Arts. McQuitty has been working with this medium for about 2 years.
